THE SUNSHINE CONCERTS 2023

After a busy year playing a variety of musical programs, the Cape Town Baroque Orchestra's 2023 outreach series, called the Sunshine Concerts, were scheduled to take place in December.

The program is for people who are unable to attend concerts because they are elderly, indigent, or disabled in some way.

For the 2023 series there was a small change of instrumentation from previous years, and we included a keyboard with three stringed instruments.

Members of our group were Craig Williams (violin), Remi Ludick (viola), Cheryl de Havilland (cello) and Erik Dippenaar (spinetto).

We played at the following homes:

Douglas Murray Home, Retreat; Lilac Residence Old Age Home, Welgelegen; Rosedon House, Rondebosch East; Nazareth House, Cape Town; Adams Farm, Plumstead; and Murambi House, Wynberg.

Scheduling of the concerts for December meant that we received requests from many venues to include Christmas music in our program.

We played a mix of popular baroque music by Bach, Handel and Pachelbel, and some less well-known baroque dances by Bassani; we also included several Christmas Carols, and we invited the residents to sing along to these. Their participation in this way always seems to create a happy atmosphere at the concerts.

<u>Douglas Murray Home</u> is a residential facility providing care and safety for the aged and frail. It is a venue that we have enjoyed visiting since our first set of concerts in 2009. There was a full hall of residents, many of whom now know our faces, and everyone enjoyed our music.

In this time of financial struggle in the NPO sector, it is extremely challenging to raise much needed funding to purchase the basic needs for the Elders. Your contribution makes it possible for us to ensure that the Elders have their needs met. In this way we can continue rendering much-needed services. We are eternally grateful to you for your continued support and prayers to Douglas Murray Home for the Aged and appreciate the positive impact and change that your contribution towards investing in this great cause has created.

<u>Lilac Residence</u> is an Old Age Home in Cape Town with an Assisted Living Facility, and it has a team of dedicated staff who take care of people in a dignified way.

This was our first visit to the home. There was a small group of approximately 20 residents, and many appeared to be only partially responsive. However, it was clear that our music was warmly received, with a request to return next year.

Rosedon House is a residential facility for adults with Cerebral Palsy who are no longer able to live independently or with their families. The residents come from communities across the Western Cape and have varying degrees of cerebral palsy. This is a venue we have visited frequently over the years and there is always great excitement in anticipation of our visit. They love to sing, and for one resident our visit is a highlight because he takes the opportunity to conduct us, much to the entertainment of all! As at many of the venues we have played, several people stood up to speak and to thank us for coming to play for them, each in their own heartfelt way.

<u>Murambi House</u> is a Retirement Home, and one of the longest established Geriatric Homes in the Western Cape. This was our first time playing at the Home. Although the residents sat quietly while we played, all were very appreciative of our visit and loved hearing our music.
