This serves as a report of CTB'S TRAVELLING CONCERT PROGRAM, called the SUNSHINE CONCERTS which first began in 2009. The concerts have become important outreach events within our calendar and have taken place each year, except for one year where no concerts were possible due to the pandemic.

Our latest series of concerts for 2024 took place in January this year. They were our 15th set of concerts in this very successful program which is designed for people who are unable to travel to hear music because they are elderly, indigent, or disabled.



In the last few years, we have played the series at the end of the year. However, for 2024 there was a small delay in programming them, and they were scheduled instead for the start of 2025.

We played at six venues, several of which we have played at before, and one concert was at a new venue.

Douglas Murray Home

Our concert venues for this series:

<u>Woodside Care Centre</u>, Rondebosch East. A residential home for profoundly intellectually disabled children and young adults. All its residents require specialised care and are unable to remain within their family units.

<u>Douglas Murray Home for the Aged</u>, Cafda Village, Retreat provides safe, dignified care for individuals from under-served communities and enables residents to enjoy their last moments in a space filled with respect, compassion and dignity.

<u>Lilac Residence for Aged Care</u>, Welgelegen 2, Cape Town. This Home combines care, medical assistance and companionship for the aged and frail.

<u>Nazareth House</u>, Assisted Living and Frail Care for the elderly, Vredehoek, Cape Town is a home that cares for the sick, destitute, aged and under privileged.

Lilac Residence for Aged Care, Melkbosstrand, Cape Town.

<u>Murambi House</u>, Frail Care, Wynberg, Cape Town. A geriatric home for dementia/alzheimers patients, as well as those who are bedridden or terminally ill.

Listening to live music seems to provide something special for these residents, and often for the staff too and we appreciate the privilege of making music for them and the positive impact it has.
